Marie**, **Ontario. The launch of this program** marks a significant milestone in the collaboration between WFI and SKG. The program will commence on September 22, 2025 and run until July 2026.

The Lab 1 program provides students with hands-on training in filmmaking, covering everything from concept development and screenwriting to cinematography and post-production techniques. Graduates will earn a Certificate in Short Film Production and develop professional skills to launch their careers or pursue further studies in film.
