Position Summary:

The Director of Anishinaabe Engagement and Student Success is a key leadership position at Shingwauk Kinoomage Gamig (SKG). The role is responsible for advancing Anishinaabe ways of knowing, being, and doing within student services, cultural and language programming, library and academic resources, and learner success initiatives. The Director will ensure programs and services align with SKG's commitment to Anishinaabe aadziwin, the Seven Grandfather Teachings, and the vision of SKG as a culturally rooted institution of higher learning.

Key Responsibilities:

- Develop and implement strategic initiatives that enhance student success and reflect Anishinaabe teachings and practices.
- Collaborate with SKG leadership to integrate Anishinaabe knowledge systems across all studentfocused programs and services.
- Oversee the delivery of holistic student services, including academic advising, counseling, and wellness initiatives.
- Guide the development and delivery of programs focused on Anishinaabe culture, language, and traditions.
- Collaborate with Elders, Knowledge Keepers, and language experts to ensure authenticity and community engagement.
- Promote language revitalization efforts through partnerships and programming.
- Oversee the development and management of library services and resources that prioritize Anishinaabe knowledge and research.
- Supervise and support staff in student services, cultural and language programming, and library services.
- Provide mentorship and professional development opportunities for team members.
- Build and maintain relationships with local communities, Elders, Knowledge Keepers, and partner organizations.
- Represent SKG in external forums to advocate for Anishinaabe learning and student success.
- Gather feedback and insights to enhance language and cultural programming.
- Attend and represent SKG on various committees and advisory groups as needed
- Develop and manage budgets for areas of responsibility, ensuring alignment with SKG's strategic goals.
- Establish metrics and reporting mechanisms to assess the impact of programs and services.
