

Shingwauk Kinoomaage Gamig Secures 10-Year Approval from Indigenous Advanced Education Skills Council

A Historic Milestone in SKG's Journey Toward Full Accreditation

(Bawaating - Sault Ste. Marie, ON – August 19, 2025): Shingwauk Kinoomaage Gamig (SKG) proudly announces the successful completion of its organizational review with the Indigenous Advanced Education Skills Council (IAESC), marking a historic milestone in SKG's path toward full accreditation.

On August 8, 2025, pursuant to Section 4(1) of the *Indigenous Institutes Act, 2017*, SKG received 10-year approval, with a mid-term review scheduled at the five-year mark. This approval grants SKG the authority to submit new program proposals directly to IAESC for stand-alone accreditation, opening the door to expanding educational opportunities rooted in Anishinaabe knowledge and ways of being.

"This achievement reflects the vision of Chief Shingwaukoonse to establish a Teaching Lodge where Anishinaabe people could learn in ways that honour their identity, culture, and knowledge systems," said Mary Wabano-McKay, President / Chief Academic Officer. "It is a moment of pride, not only for SKG, but for our students, graduates, and the communities we serve."
